The following services are offered at the Family Justice Center:

• Child Protection Services

CPS is a division of Idaho Department of Health and Welfare and can assist you in planning for the safety of you and your children.

• Counseling

Counseling is offered from a licensed professional providing clients with additional emotional support.

• Idaho Legal Aid Services, Inc.

An Idaho Legal Aid attorney is located with in the FJC to assist you with any civil-legal action and advice you may need assistance with in regards to divorce, custody and/or civil protection order.

• Law Enforcement /Victim Witness Coordinator

You may contact the Nampa Police Department to report a crime as well as speak to the detective handling the case and the victim witness coordinator.

• Idaho Department of Health & Welfare

We provide application assistance for state benefits such as cash assistance, food stamps, etc.

• Idaho Child Find Program

Child Find is a service that screens and monitors children's growth and development from birth through three years of age. A coordinator is available to help answer questions about your child's development.

• Valley Crisis Center

The local shelter here in Nampa, that can provide assistance with emergency shelter and other services to assist victims of domestic violence.

• Community Council of Idaho

Can help to improve the cultural, social and economic status of the people they serve through workforce civil rights advocacy, workforce preparation, education and social services.

• Nampa & Canyon Co. Prosecuting Attorney/Victim Witness Coordinator

You may contact these offices to discuss a pending criminal case, speak to the victims witness coordinator and receive assistance through the process.

• Easter Seals Goodwill/Working Solutions

A tri-state agency that helps people with job readiness skills to enter the workforce.

• Catholic Charities of Idaho

Helps with immigration assistance for survivors of domestic violence under the Violence Against Women's Act law.

• Idaho Council Against Sexual & Domestic Violence

Transitional housing assistance. This is a one time payment for up to \$400.00 that can either go to helping you move into a new home or helping pay for a utility bill (due to domestic violence).

• Casey Family Programs

This program helps assist with foster parents, kinship parents, or adoptive parents. Helping to provide safe loving homes for youth in the area.

• Idaho Crime Victims Compensation

If you are or were a victim of a recent domestic Violence, sexual assault or child abuse crime, you may be eligible for compensation through ICVC. Applications are available at the FJC and there is a representative from that agency is available on Thursday afternoons at the FJC.

- Safety planning
